



RUNNING ENERGY SPARKS AS A CLUB

ASK FOR APPLICATIONS

Ask children to interview or write letters of applications for the position of Energy Team telling you why they want to help and what interests, experiences and strengths they have.

MEET REGULARLY

To keep momentum going try to meet several times a term, ideally once a fortnight at least.

GET PARENTS AND VOLUNTEERS INVOLVED
